


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जैन धर्म दिवाकर आचार्य सम्राट

आचार्य सम्राट पूज्य श्री आत्माराम जी का जन्म राहों जिला जालंधर में बाबन द्वाशी संवत् 1882 के पावन दिन पिता श्री मनशाराम व माता श्रीमती परमेश्वरी देवी के घर चोपड़ा क्षत्रिय वंश में हुआ था। प्रारंभ में ही आपको जीवन में अनेक कष्ट उठाने पड़े जिससे आप संसार के प्रति उदासीन हो गए। भाग्य से आप छोटी आयु में ही जैन संतो की शरण में आ गए। मात्र 11 वर्ष की आयु में ही आपश्री को बनूड़ की धरती पर जिन दीक्षा प्रदान की गई।

स्वाध्याय में आपश्री को विशेष रूचि थी जिससे आपको अपाध्याय पद से विभूषित किया गया। सन् 1952 में आपश्री को अखिल भारतीय श्रमण संघ में प्रथम आचार्य सम्राट पद से अलंकृत किया गया। आपश्री की रमरण शक्ति बड़ी प्रबल थी जिससे आप विद्वदनगत में बड़े लोकप्रिय हो गए। आपश्री में सहनशीलता बहुत थी जिसका प्रदर्शन आपकी रोगावस्था में हुआ। आपश्री ने 30 जनवरी 1962 को लंबी संयम यात्रा पूर्ण करके जर्जर शरीर को त्याग दिया और देवलोक गमन कर गए।



आप जी की प्रेरणा से नई दाना मंडी बहादुर रोड, लुधियाना में निर्मित जयदास राम जैन चैरिटेबल अस्पताल तथा रूपा मिस्त्री गली, लुधियाना में आप जी के नाम पर चल रहे श्री रत्नमुनि चैरिटेबल अस्पताल में गरीबों के लिए निशु:ल्क मैडिकल सेवाओं की उचित व्यवस्था है।

मानवता की अटूट सेवा में रत, यह महापथिक 2 सितम्बर, 2010 को पंचतत्व में विलीन हो गये। आपके महान जीवन और आदर्शों को जन-जन में प्रेरित करने के लिए एस. एस. जैन गर्ल्ज स्कूल कमेटी ने कालेज में आपकी स्मृति में 'साधना केन्द्र' का निर्माण किया है।



Jain Girls School Committee (Regd.). Behan Devki Devi Ji was an eminent educationist of her times. She was the founder principal of Jain Girls Senior Secondary School, Ludhiana, who always cherished the dream of providing higher education to the female section of this backward Industrial Area of Ludhiana irrespective of class, caste, religion or language. - To provide peaceful, comfortable and friendly environment by providing facilities like canteen, Juice bar, common room, lush green lawns in the campus.
- To keep the students physically fit by continually investing money for building sports and gymnasium facilities in the college.
- To cope up with the stress and strain of modern lifestyle and to break the monotony, a meditation centre has been set up in the college campus.
- To manage college resources effectively and efficiently to meet the need of the students and staff.
- To work in collaboration with the parents to ensure that the students get quality education in a guarded environment so that they can blossom into responsible and contributing citizens of our nation and serve the society.
- To employ competent, dedicated and loyal staff and to provide them a comfortable and stress free working environment and
 opportunities for their academic and intellectual excellence and growth.

General Conditions Regarding Eligibility

(a) It must be ensured that the examination passed by a candidate on the basis of which she is seeking admission to the next higher class in the College stands recognized by the Panjab University. For this purpose, the Equivalence Booklet printed in the year 1999 be consulted along with the Consolidated Supplementary List, 2004 to 2007 already sent to all the Colleges by the General Branch. However, if any College does not have the printed Equivalence Booklet, 1999, the same may be obtained from the Printing Store of the University on payment of prescribed cost.

(b) Only eligible candidates be admitted to the course concerned. Responsibility for making wrong admission or allowing wrong combination of subjects to a student, shall lie entirely with the College/Department Authorities.

(C) All Foreign Students shall obtain Eligibility Certificate from the Deputy Registrar (General), Panjab University in all cases and the admission of the foreign students to College / Teaching Departments would be governed by the Guidelines issued by the Dean Foreign Students. The eligibility form should be accompanied by a forwarding letter from the Principal of the College/Chairperson of the Teaching Department indicating the reason for denying the admission to the candidate. After obtaining the Eligibility Certificate, the candidate should submit the same to College/Department where she is seeking admission.

(d) An affidavit in duplicate from each candidate having gap year seeking admission to the College/Department to the effect that she was not disqualified by any Board/Body/Council/University and she was not already registered with the Panjab University (wherever applicable), must be obtained by the concerned College/Department before allowing admission. In case the candidate was disqualified, the period of disqualification and the activities in which the candidate was involved during the period of disqualification, should be indicated by the candidate in the said affidavit. A copy of the affidavit be sent to the University (R&S Branch) along with Registration Return. No candidate be admitted under any circumstances during the disqualification period.



In case of re-admission after a long spell, the candidate must quote her old Registration Number of Panjab University.

- (e) That a candidate who has been placed under compartment/re-appear in one subject only with at least 20% marks (Theory & Practical taken together) in the subject in which he/she has been placed in compartment in the +2 examination conducted by the Open School Board in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the 1st Semester of B.A.(General)/B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A. course under 10+2+3 system of education. She should have cleared the compartment before the declaration of the first year result. If she could not submit the relevant papers/documents on the date of declaration of result then her admission will be automatically cancelled. {with effect from the academic session 2009-2010} (Amended vide Syndicate Para-16 dated 18.05.2014).
- (f) The candidate who is admitted in first/third/fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively. However, for promotion from second to third or from fourth to fifth semester the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester. It is further clarified that for calculating 50% fraction, like, 2.5, 3.5 or 4.5 will be considered as 3, 4 or 5 respectively.
- (g) The candidate who got admission in 1st semester in a college and after completing the 1st semester could not get the admission in 2nd Semester due to one or other reason, should be given admission in the 2nd semester next year with the condition that the candidate must have attended the classes / appeared in examinations in the college in 1st semester. To overcome this problem, few admission dates for 2nd semester should also be allotted in January i.e. one week after the Winter Break as per P.U. Academic Calendar, 2019-20. (As per Syndicate Para 49 Dated 01-05-2016).
- (h) A candidate who appeared under semester system for under graduate courses is allowed to take admission under semester system in M.A./M.Sc. if she has two re-appears in 3rd, 4th, 5th & 6th Semester. The candidate will not be allowed to take admission in M.A./M.Sc. if she has re-appear in the subject in undergraduate classes in which she wants to take admission in M.A./M.Sc. courses. The admission to M.A./M.Sc. course shall be done on the basis of merit. In case any seat is lying vacant after exhausting the merit list upto the last date of admission only then the principal can adjust such students.
- (i) The candidate shall not be admitted in 3rd Semester of M.A./M.Sc. if she does not clear the re-appear papers of undergraduate classes.
- (j) A candidate who has passed B.Voc (Banking, Insurance & Retailing) and B.Voc (Retail Management) be given admission in the M.Com courses as it has already been approved by the UGC.
- (k) If a student has two re-appears in B.Com she can take admission in the M.Com if she has 50% in aggregate of the passing paper subject to the conditions mentioned at 1 above.

Reservation of Seats

- (a) The reservation of seats shall be governed by the Regulation 29.1 and 29.2 given at page 168 in P.U. Cal. Volume-I, 2007 and any intimation sent by the Deputy Registrar (Colleges). However, it is clarified that the concession is not available in the case of candidates who are seeking admission to the next higher class on the basis of having earned compartment in +2 Examination i.e. in the subject of compartment.
- (b) (i) Two Additional Seats for One Girl out of the only Two Girl Children per unit per course subject to maximum limit of four
 - (ii) One Additional seat for Cancer Patients
 - (iii) AIDS Patients
 - (iv) Thalassemia Patients

The above concession by way of additional seats is not applicable to the students falling under regulatory agencies such as MCI, DCI, BCI and NCTE. As per circular No. Misc./A-6/77174-77374 dated 30.03.2016 (copy attached).

- (c) (i) Two Additional seats for Rural Area Students.
 - (ii) One additional seat for Border Area students over and above the sanctioned seats for UG/PG Courses offered by the Teaching Departments/Regional Centres/and Colleges affiliated to Panjab University vide circular No. Misc/A-6/77824-78124 dated 20.04.2016 (copy attached).
 - (iii) Institutions up to academic year 2020-21 only to those wards of martyrs/permanent disabled (up to 80% leading to incapacitation) of KARGIL WAR who have a valid certificate from the Ministry of Defence to this and the same be entered in the Pension Book of the family:-
 - (i) 1% seats with minimum of 1 seat in the Departments and affiliated Colleges except in partially financed/self-financing courses.
 - (ii) Exemption of fee.
 - (iii) Exemption in hostel fee. (Vide Syndicate Para 30 (XI) dated 29.7.08).
 - (IV) (i) Blind students who join a regular degree/Post-graduate degree courses at the P.U. would be allowed exemption from payment of tuition fee & would be provided free accommodation in the University Hostels. {Approved vide Syndicate Para (iv) meeting held on 19-08-1996}.
 - (ii) The free education to the completely blind student belonging to below poverty line, as described by the relevant Government notification/s, in any course in the University and its affiliated Colleges, subject to the students being other wise eligible and on merit, but the candidate has to submit an affidavit to this effect issued by the competent authority. Even the free hostel accommodation may also be considered, if required by the students, but she will have to pay the mess charges, which are already subsidized. A limited number of course books (one per paper) may also be considered which would be returnable after the completion of the course. (Syndicate Para-1 dated 18-04-2009).
 - (V) Free education to children of persons killed in November, 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State. {Approved vide Syndicate para 5 (Statement A) dated 25-04-1987}.

Admission To B.A. Course Semester - I

A candidate who has been placed under compartment at +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A. course she fulfills the following conditions:-

- (i) She should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which she had been placed in compartment and;
- (iii) She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of examination as laid down in the relevant regulations; Provided that;

A candidate joining the B.A. First Semester should have obtained at least 33% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by her in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practical/s taken together) taken up by her at the +2 examination.

A person who has passed one of the following examinations with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the First Semester class of B.A. (General and Honours) degree course in a College affiliated to this University, however, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examinations, shall be eligible to join B.A. - I Semester provisionally subject to her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board /Body/ Council/ University in two consecutive chances subsequent to her admission, failing which her admission to B.A.-Ist Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled:-



- (i) B.A./B.Com Part-I (Old Scheme)/Intermediate/Arts/Science/Agriculture examination of Panjab University.
- (ii) the +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized University/Board/Council.
- (iii) Prak Shastri/Vishard examination with compulsory English. (Vide Senate Para-LXXVII dated 06.12.2009)
- (iv) any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (i), (ii) and (iii) above.

Provided further that a student shall be eligible to opt the subject of-

(i) Computer Science at the B.A. level if she has passed the +2 examination with Science/Commerce/Economics/Mathematics and Computer related subject like Computer Science/ Information Technology etc. as one of the elective subjects or optional subjects.

NOTE:- The candidates, who have passed computer related subject like Computer science/Information Technology, etc. as one of the Elective subjects or optional subject at +2 level, be allowed to opt the subject of Computer Science at B.A. level w.e.f. the academic session 2012-13 (**Syndicate Para 18 dated 27.09.2011**).

Admission To Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) 1st Semester

(a) A person who has passed +2 examination in any discipline with at least 50% marks and passed Mathematics as one of the subject at Matriculation examination level shall be eligible to join the first semester class of B.C.A. Course. OR (b) Any other examination recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) above.

NOTE:-(i) 10% weight-age be given for each subject of (Mathematics/Statistics) and (Computer Science/Computer Applications/Information Technology or equivalent) to the candidate who studied at 10+2 level at the time of admission in B.C.A. 1st Semester from the admissions of 2015. (ii) That 20% weight-age in total to those students who studied (Mathematics/Statistics) and (Computer Science or Computer Applications or Information Technology or Information System) at +2 level be given.

Admission to Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) 1st Semester

- (A) Admission to the first semester of B.Com. Degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council/University:-
- a) +2 examination or B.Com.- Part-I (Old scheme) of Panjab University with three of the following subjects securing at least 45 per cent marks in the aggregate:-
 - Commerce (or theory of commerce or foundation course in commerce)
 - Accountancy (or book keeping and accountancy)
 - Economics
 - Business Organization (or Business Management or Theory and Practice of Management)
 - Insurance (or General Insurance or Life Insurance)
 - Banking and Trade
 - Commercial Geography
 - Office Management and Secretarial Practice (or Office Organization and Management)
 - Mercantile Law (or any Company Law)
 - Auditing



Typewriting and Stenography/Computers (for typewriting)

- b) +2 Examination or B.A. Part-I (Old Scheme) of Panjab University with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
- c) +2 Examination or B.A. Part-I/B.Sc.-I/Pre-Engineering/Pre-Medical Examination of the Panjab University under the Old Scheme not covered in (b) securing at least 50% marks.
- d) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a) or (b) or (c) as given above with requisite percentage of marks given under each clause.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the first semester of B.Com. should have passed in the subject of English at the +2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies/Councils/Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after she has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to her admission.

In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to her subsequent to the date of her admission, her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled. Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.Com course, provided she fulfills the following conditions:

- (i) She should have been placed compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after she has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to her subsequent to the date of his/her admission, his/her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

- **(B)** Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit. The merit for this purpose shall be determined on the basis of the score of a candidate to be computed as follows:
- (i) Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination;
- (ii) Add score of 4 for each of the subjects passed from the subjects referred in 3.1
- A (a) not exceeding 16 in total.

Explanation:- In cases of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed under compartment.

NOTE:- The candidates securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.Com. Part-I courses, if they cleared or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is/are available (Syndicate para 43 (xiv) meeting held on 27-01-2013).

Admission To Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) 1st (Semester System)

- (A) Admission to the first semester of BBA degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/Council/University:-
- (a) +2 examination securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;
- (b) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to
- (c) as given above with requisite percentage of marks.



Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the first semester should have passed in the subject of English at the +2 examination level and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/Bodies/Councils/Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after she has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to her admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to her subsequent to the date of her admission, her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled. Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/Bodies/Councils/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of BBA course, provided she fulfills the following conditions:-

- (i) She should have been placed compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which she had been placed in compartment; and
- (iii) She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after she has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to her admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to her subsequent to the date of her admission, her provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

Explanation:- In case of a compartment candidate, eligibility shall be determined by including the marks of the subject in which the candidate has been placed under compartment.

(B) Subject to the reservation made by the University, the admission shall be on merit.

Rules For Admission To Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.)

1. Duration:-

- 1.1 The duration of course leading to the degree of **Bachelor of Vocation** (B.Voc.) shall be three academic years (6 semesters). The examination for the first semester shall ordinarily be held in the month of December and for the second in the month of June or such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate from time to time. Assessment and evaluation system for the B.Voc. should be credit based system.
- 1.2 If a candidate wishes to leave the course after successful completion of the first year, he/she will be offered Diploma of Vocation in that particular stream.
- 1.3 If the candidate wishes to leave after successful completion of the second year, he/she will be offered Advanced Diploma of Vocation in that particular stream.
- 2. Eligibility:- The minimum qualification for admission to the First Year of the course shall be 10+2 in any discipline of the University/Board/Council or examination of any other University which has been recognized by the syndicate as equivalent thereto with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate. Admission will be based on merit and should follow the reservation policy as adopted by the Panjab University.

3. Examinations:-

3.1 The Principal of the College shall finalize and forward to the controller of examinations at least two weeks before the commencement of the examination for each semester, a list of the students (along with the examination forms complete in all respect for verification of fee and issuing of roll numbers) who have satisfied the requirements of regulations and are qualified to appear in the examination.

- 3.2 The last date for receipt of admission application form and fee with and without late fee shall be as fixed by the Syndicate from time to time.
- 4. First semester examination shall be open to a regular student who:-
 - (i) has been on the rolls of the affiliated college during one semester preceding the first semester examination; and
 - (ii) has attended not less then 75% of the lectures, seminars, case discussions, field trips, project work etc., in each paper; a deficiency up to 10% may be condoned by the Principal of the affiliated college.
- 5. Second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth semester examinations shall be open to a student who:-
 - (i) has been on the rolls of the affiliated college during one semester preceding the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth semester examination, as the case may be:
 - (ii) has attended not less then 75% of the lectures, seminars, case discussions, field trips, project work etc., in each paper; a deficiency up to 10% may be condoned by the Principal of the affiliated college.
 - (iii) has passed the first, second, third, fourth, fifth semester examinations respectively or is covered under re-appear regulation.
- 6. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.
- 7. Passing Criteria:-
- 7.1 The minimum number of marks to pass the examination in each semester shall be:-
 - (i) 35% in each paper in the University examination separately as well as jointly with internal assessment,
 - (ii) 35% in seminar, project, viva voce, field work etc.
 - (iii) 40% in the aggregate of (i) and (ii) above.
- 7.2 Grace marks shall be given @ 1% of the aggregate marks of the external examination of the University for each semester (only the marks of external examination will be counted for the purpose of calculating the grace marks and marks obtained in the internal assessment will not be counted). A candidate may avail of the grace marks either in the aggregate or in one or more papers as may be to his/her advantage. Grace marks, shall however, be given only for passing the examination or for earning the higher division and not for passing the examination with distinction as well as position.

Admission To M.Sc. (IT) Semester System Course

A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible to join Part-I of M.Sc. (I.T.) (First Semester):

- (i) B.C.A. examination from the Panjab University.
- (ii) B.E. / B.Tech. in Computer Science/Information Technology from the Panjab University.
- (iii) B.C.A./B.Sc. (Hons.) in Computer Science/B.Sc. (H.S.) in Mathematics & Computing or any other graduation with Computer Science/I.T./Computer Applications and Mathematics in all three years of graduation.
- (iv) Any examination of another University recognized by Panjab University, Chandigarh as equivalent to any of the above examination."

Migration/Deficient Subject(s)

A candidate who has passed his/her 1st Semester and 2nd Semester of B.A. / B.Sc. (General) / B.Com. / B.B.A. / B.C.A. Course conducted by another University/College affiliated to another university in India under specific authorization by the University concerned, be allowed to migrate to a college affiliated to this University/Department of Evening Studies/University School of Open Learning in the 3rd semester/5th semester of the respective course (as per rules prescribed under Chapter XIV – 'Migration of Students' Page No. 289 to 304 of P.U. Calendar Volume-III, 2016) on the condition that such a candidate will have to clear the deficient subject/s if any, within the permissible chances.

Deficiencies should be determined by the Principal/Chairperson at the time of admission under intimation to University (i.e. on the Registration Return and examination forms) as well as to the students as per University rule No.6 given at page 302 of P.U.Cal. Vol-III, 2016.

The students seeking admission to M.Com Ist semester will present themselves before incharge of admissions on the dates to be specified on the college notice board.

1. The duration of the course leading to the degree of Master of Commerce (M.Com) shall be of two academic years. Each year shall be divided into two semesters. The examination for the first and the third semester will be held in the month of December/January or on such dates as may be fixed by the university.



- 2. The minimum qualification for admissions to the first semester of the course shall be :
 - (a) B. Com /B.B.A./B.Com (Hons.) with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate. OR
 - (b) A graduate with Honours in Economics OR Mathematics OR Statistics OR Commerce with not less than 45% marks in aggregate.
- 3. Each regular student shall be assessed internally in each subject on the basis of (I) Seminar (ii) Project and viva-voce (iii) internal assessment (iv) Project and Workshop. Viva-Voce may be conducted jointly by the internal and external examiners.
- 4. The 2nd, 3rd and 4th Semester shall be open to a regular student who:
 - (a) has been on the rolls of the department/ College during one semester preceding the 2nd, 3rd or 4th Semester examination as the case may be.
 - (b) has attended not less than 75% of lectures and attended seminars, case discussions, field trips, project work, etc. for each paper.
- 5. A candidate, who having passed the second semester examination if discontinues his/her studies, may be permitted to join the 3rd semester within two years of his/her passing the second semester examination.
- 6. The medium both for instruction and examination shall be English.

The admission to M.Com. will be on the basis of merit list prepared by the college. A student will be given weightages as per the number of commerce courses she has studied in 10+2 examination as per guidelines of Panjab University. The Merit List will be displayed on the college notice board as per the admission policy and admission schedule.

The minimum qualification for the course shall be :

Change Of Subject

A student may change her subject with in fifteen days from the beginning of classes with the permission of the convenor. Thereafter the subject will be changed with the permission of the Principal. Lectures in the changed Subject will be counted from the day the classes start, and not from the date of changing the subject.

Note: * In case the number of students in particular subject falls below the prescribed limit, the college authorities reserve the right to change the subject.

Fees for the change of special subject will not be refunded.

Important: English and Punjabi are compulsory subjects. Any change in the rule relating to subjects done by Panjab University, Chandigarh will be applicable accordingly.

General Tutorial System

The tutorial system helps to discover the talent of student and to channelize their energies in the right direction, Each student is placed under the personal supervision of a tutor, who keeps a complete record of his progress. The tutor looks after the student as a guardian and students are advised to remain in constant touch with her. The tutorial are held once a week. Group meetings are held on every alternate Saturday. The Presence of students in these meetings is compulsory. Absence from tutorial Groups entails a fine of ₹10.

Rules and Regulations

The Students are expected to be regular and punctual. Every Student is required to attend 75% of the total Lectures delivered during the academic session in order to be eligible for appearing in the university examination failing which the student will be detained and shall have to appear in the university examination privately.

Identity Card

Each student is issued Library cum-Identity card bearing her photograph, name and Roll No. All students are required to carry their identity cards with them during their presence on the campus. The defaulters will be fined heavily. If the identity card is lost, duplicate card can be issued from the office on the payment of `10.

College Library

The College has a well stocked computerized Library with the stocks exceeding thirty thousand volumes. The Library of the college provides free internet facility and a variety of journals, magazines, periodicals and newspapers published within country as well as abroad. It also provides access to a number of e-journals. The Library consists of a Reading Hall, a Periodical Section and a Reference Section and The library is open from 9am to 4pm. Our library has open shelf system which gives an easy access to the books.

The following library rules are to be observed by a student :

- 1. An undergraduate student can draw 2 books and a P.G. Student can draw four books at a time:
- 2. Every student will be issued a diary containing the borrower's card which will be stamped by the Librarian every time a book is issued or returned.
- 3. The Library card is non-transferable. It should be kept carefully, for the library authorities, can at anytime, call upon a student to produce the same in support of her claim to draw a book.
- 4. A student will be responsible for all books drawn on her card.
- 5. Loss of Library card must be immediately reported to the librarian so as to avoid its misuse by anyone. A fine of ₹20 will be charged for loss of library card.

- 6. Books may ordinarily be retained for a period of seven days.
- 7. A fine of ₹1 per volume shall be charged for the books kept after the due date.
- 8. Books may be recalled at any time by the Librarian.
- 9. Anyone who defaces or otherwise mutilates a book or newspaper, tears or removes pages, shall have to pay for its replacement.

In case the book is part of a set, the student shall have to bear the cost of replacement of the entire set.

- 10. Pindrop silence must be observed in the library and in the Reading room.
- 11. Library will be closed once a year for the purpose of stock checking. All books borrowed from the library will have to be returned by the time notified for the purpose.

Note: Text books are given free of charge to poor and deserving students out of Book-Bank.

Note: Library Security will be refunded to the students of outgoing classes by 31 October.



College Leave Rules

- 1. In case of leave, it must be applied for in advance on the prescribed performa available with the college office. An application for leave must be countersigned by the student's Parents / Guardians. Leave will be sanctioned by the Principal on recommendation of the tutor. In case of illness, the application should be supported by a medical certificate.
- 2. Leave for a particular lecture may be granted by the lecturer concerned. Absence from classes without leave entails a fine of ₹2/- per period.
- 3. Absence from group meeting/NSS meeting NCC Parade entails a fine ₹10.
- 4. The name of the student absenting herself from the college for a period of two weeks without getting the leave sanctioned, shall be automatically struck-off rolls of the college.
- 5. Re-admission will be allowed with the permision of the Principal on payment of Re-admission fee of ₹110.
- 6. The maximum leave allowed during the session will be 15 days only.
- 7. Leave upto 4 days will be granted by the tutor and more than 4 days by the Principal on recommendation of Senior tutor.
- 8. On days when special functions are held the leave will be sanctioned only by the Principal.
- 9. Important: Leave sanctioned will not relax 75% attendance conditions.

Procedure To Get Leave

Get a leave from the office.

- Fill the leave form, get It signed from your parents/guardian.
- Attach supporting document i.e. medical certificate, marriage card etc.
- Get it signed from the tutor.

- Deposit one copy of the signed form in the office, give the second copy to the tutor and retain the third for future reference.
- Your leave may be sanctioned now.

Roll Of Honour: College Colour And Merit Certificate

Roll of Honour, College colour and merit cetifcates will be awarded to the student for their extraordinary performance in academics, cultural activities and sports.

Education / Academics

- a) Roll of Honour in the category will be awarded to the student who has passed last examination of university in first division and has either achieved one of the first three positions in the combined merit list of the university or has obtained first position amongst the girls in the merit list of the university.
- b) Merit Certificate: Merit certificate will be given to a student either for securing any/one of the first three positions in B.A./B.Sc/B. Com-I, II, III and M.A. I, II, III examinations conducted by Panjab University or for securing first position amongst the girls in the merit list of P.U.

Social And Cultural Activities

- a) Roll of Honour in social and cultural activities will be awarded either for getting first position for an individual item in University/Inter Varsity/ State/ National level competition or for securing at least 25 marks in inter college competitions.
- b) Roll of Honour will be awarded for a group item. All participants of the winning team will be given three marks each if they do not win any individual prizes.

Apart from this the candidates with following achievements will also be awarded Roll of Honour.

a) A student participating in Republic Day Parade/Camp.

College Colour

The college colour in this category will be awarded either to a student winning second prize in an individual item in a university Inter-Versity, State or National level Competition or to the members of a winning team in any group-item.

Merit Certificate

Merit Certificate in the category of social and cultural activities will be awarded either to a student securing third prize in an individual item in a competition organised at University, Inter-Versity, State or National or to be member of a team getting second position in a group-item in inter-college competition.

Sports Roll Of Honour

Roll of Honour in sports will be awarded to the players and athletes in following categories:

- 1. Either to the member of the team securing first or second position in a senior National /All India Inter-Versity championship or to the players bagging first, second or third prizes in individual competitions at the same levels.
- 2. To the member of a team, winning Junior National Championship and to a player securing second place in an individual compitition at the same level.
- 3. To the member of Combined University National Team.
- 4. To the captain of Panjab University Team.
- a) College Colour: College-colour will be awarded to all members of college team winning any University Championship.
- b) College Colour will be awarded to a player for her selection as member of the team for interversity or National Championship or to a player for securing first and second position in individual competitions.
- c) College-colour will be awarded to the best athlete of the college also.



Merit Certificate

Merit Certificate will be awarded either to the members of the team securing third or fourth position in the competitions held at university or state-level or to the players for securing III or IV position in the individual competitions at the same level.

Note: Roll of honour, College color and merit certificate will be awarded only to those students whose conduct is found satisfactory during their stay in the college and against whom no inquiry is pending for serious misconduct and, misbehaviour. Above mentioned honour will be conferred only on those students who show regular attendance in all the subjects separately and in college in general.

Important

House Test are compulsory for all the students. Students who either do not appear or clear will be penalized according to rules of the college

Unfair-Means

A student found guilty of using unfair means in an examination shall be fined according to the gravity of offence, It will authomatically render the student ineligible for the award of any prize, concession, scholarship of stipend for a year.

Students who fail to obtain 25% marks in aggregate in both the tests may be allowed to qualify the special test also, their university examination form will be sent provisionally only and will not be guaranteed for issuing of University exam Roll No.

Eligibility Conditions For Appearing In The University Examination

The examination form of a student will be sent provisionally in Oct/Nov. for the annual examination. Every student is required to attend at least 75% of lectures delivered in each subject both in theory and practical. (To be counted up till two weeks before the commencement of examination.) She will have to secure atleast 25% of marks in aggregate of all the subjects in House examination. Rules for admission to University Examination shall be strictly adhered to. No concession whatever shall be given to any student. If the required percentage of lectures is deficient on account of sports, NCC, NSS events, activities or other co-curricular activities, certified by the authorities, the credit may be given by the principal for the number of days for which prior exemption was obtained.

Fee Concession, Scholarship and Stipends

Scholarship under the Government of India and postmatric Scholarship schemes are available to scheduled Castes/Tribes Students. The prescribed application forms and entitlement cards which such students are required to submit can be obtained free of cost from the college office as well as from the office of the District Welfare Officer. The Students should submit the application forms and entitlement cards to the college along with their application form for onwards submission to the D.P.I. (Colleges) Punjab. Provided they have secured more than 40% marks in the previous examination and the annual income of their guardians does not exceed ₹1,00,000/-P.A.

The fee concession forms complete in all respects, should be submitted along with Admission forms at the time of admission.
- b) Those Scheduled Caste students whose parents are Gazetted officers or pay income tax are not eligible for fee concession.
- 8. All students belong to scheduled castes/Tribes should meet the superintendent immediately after joining the college to complete their applications for stipends.
- 9. Half fee concessions upto the limit of 10% of the total enrolment in each class will be granted to deserving students.
- 10. Full fee concession will be granted to students of the scheduled and backward classes as per Govt. rules and instructions.
- 11. Fee concessions, Stipends and Scholarships of all categories are liable to be withdrawn if performance in studies falls or student remains irregular in attendance or is found guilty of misbehaviour.
- 12. Children of 100% physically disabled, riot affected persons.
- 13. Children of Sikh migrants shall also be eligible for fee concession upto university level in professional Arts/ Science institutions in the state and in privately managed aided Schools & Colleges. The facility shall be available to only those students who are pursuing their studies in the state of Punjab and shall be restricted to tuition fee including college funds but shall not include hostel expenses. The students who repeat a year in a class shall not be eligible for this concession for that particular year.
- 14. Children of army deserters killed, 100% physically disabled shall also be eligible for free education upto the University level.
- 15. There is 50%, 35%, 25% fee concession for students who will get first, second and third position in the university and scholarships (a) ₹1500/- p.a. to the brilliant students who get 80% and above marks in the Annual University Examination.

Note: The students belonging to reserved categories (i.e. the ones mentioned in column (b) must open their saving A/C in the bank and submit their pass-books with the office at the time of admission)

Punjab Rights To Service Act, 2011

The PRTS Act, 2011 has empowered people to seek services in a hassle free, corruption free, transparent and time bound manner through different service delivery mechanisms. The Government has notified 149 Services under the Act for time bound delivery and also notified the desigated officers, first Appellate Authority, second Appellate Authority Department of Higher Education, Punjab provides service under this Act.

Code Of Conduct

The students of college are required to observe the following code of conduct both in and outside the classroom.

- 1. The students are required to be punctual and regular in attending their classes. A student who remains absent from the college for two weeks without any intimation to the office will be treated as a defaulter and her name will be struck off the rolls even if she has paid tuition fees etc. for the current month in which she has been absent or for following months.
- 2. Students having first period must attend the morning assembly. They must listen carefully to the instructions given during assembly and follow them earnestly.
- 3. All the students are required to wear white uniform on Monday and on certain academic functions of the college.
- 4. It is the foremost duty of the students to keep college lawns and playground neat and clean. Plucking of flowers is strictly prohibited. Writing and sticking bills on the walls of the college is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Roaming around the corridors is not allowed. Movement from the classroom to another should be orderly. In vacant periods students should go to the Library or common room.



- 6. No outsider is permitted to meet the students without the Permission of the Principal (Students are not allowed to do any of their Personal correspondence at the college address.)
- 7. Students must park their vehicles in the parking area. The college will not be responsible for any loss of the unlocked vehicle. No student is allowed to bring four wheeler to the college.
- 8. Use of Mobile Phones on the college campus is strictly prohibited. Students defying the rules will be fined heavily.
- 9. Quarrels and disputes should be avoided. In the event of any dispute a written complaint should be made to the Principal.
- 10. The students should immediately report the change of address and phone no. (if any) to the college office.
- 11. Students are expected to conduct themselves with dignity, modesty and simplicity during their stay in college. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authorities, they will duly punish the guilty students.
